Autreat is a retreat-style conference run by autistic people, for autistic people and our friends.



Autreat focuses on positive living with autism, NOT on causes, cures, or ways to make us more normal.



REGISTRATION FORM AND FEES

All sums are in U.S. dollars. Early registration discount: If you register before June 1, 2010, we offer a discount of \$10/person (or \$3 per day). Please subtract the amount on your registration form. **Full registration** includes lodging Monday through Thursday nights, and meals from Monday supper through Friday lunch. Fees for adults and youth include a refundable room key deposit of \$25. Fees for children do not include key deposits. If you want your child to have his/her own room key, add \$25 for the key deposit.

Note 1: We realize that not all full-time jobs are high paying. If you have a full-time job but can't afford this rate, add a note explaining this, and you may register at the rate for adults without full-time jobs.

Note 2: The rate for children and teens includes a daytime activity program for children under 18. Staff:child ratio is approximately 1:6. If your child needs more support than this, please make your own arrangements for an aide.

Note 3: For children under age 6, families may bring their own portable cribs or cots, so a young child can sleep in the same room with two other family members. In that case, the child would be charged the Category F rate. If the child is sharing the room with only one other family member, Category E applies.

Note 4: This rate is for people who are attending Autreat for the purpose of providing support for a disabled person who could not otherwise participate without assistance. Examples are personal care attendants for adults and 1:1 aides for children.

Work Shift Rebate—Adults and teens paying for the full 4 days, meals, and overnights may earn a \$20 work rebate. Pay the full cost when registering. The rebate will be given upon completion of a work shift during Autreat. Full-time support people are not eligible for work shift rebates; their rate is set \$20 lower than anyone else's because we don't expect them to have time to do a work shift while also providing full-time support for another person.

A special note about social interactions

For some ANI members, meeting other autistic people and having a chance to socialize with others like ourselves is an exciting and wonderful experience. Others are not interested in social contacts and may come to this event just for the presentations. Some of us are interested in socializing some, but need to be able to take time out from interacting. Autreat is meant to provide opportunity, but not pressure, for social interactions.



Facility

Autreat is held at the Bradford, Pennsylvania campus of University of Pittsburgh, approximately 80 miles from the nearest major airport in Buffalo, New York. The campus has plenty of open space for walking, recreation, and enjoying the outdoors. Lodging is in air-conditioned apartments with small kitchenettes. Private bedrooms are available at an extra cost and as space allows. Facilities are wheelchair-accessible.

Room Options

Standard room: single bed in a 2-bed room, with one roommate (included with registration, no extra fee).

Option for couples: queen-size bed instead of two single beds (no extra fee, just indicate preference on registration form).

Private room: standard room with 2 single beds, but no roommate (add \$25 per night); private room with queen-size bed and private bathroom (add \$40 per night).

How Autreat is different from typical autism conferences

Typical autism conferences are *about* autistic people, but are primarily *for* the benefit of researchers, service providers, or families. Autreat is an opportunity for autistic people and those with related developmental differences, our friends, and supporters to come together, discover and explore autistic connections, and develop advocacy skills, all in an autistic-friendly environment. Family members and professionals are welcome to attend, but the structure and content of this event are determined by the interests and sensibilities of autistic people.

Things you will *not* find at Autreat:

- Crowded, noisy hotel or conference center
- Exhausting, intensive schedule
- Inescapable sensory bombardment
- Pressure to interact if you don't want to
- Focus on "celebrities"
- Focus on causes, cures, or ways to make us more normal

Things you *will* find at Autreat:

- Small college campus with plenty of outdoor space to get away and be alone or with friends.
- Smoke-free, perfume-free environment
- Opportunity to explore autistic social contacts, if desired
- Respect for the choice to be left alone, if preferred
- Focus on positive aspects of autism
- Child care for autistic and non-autistic children
- Four days of continuous immersion in an autistic-friendly environment
